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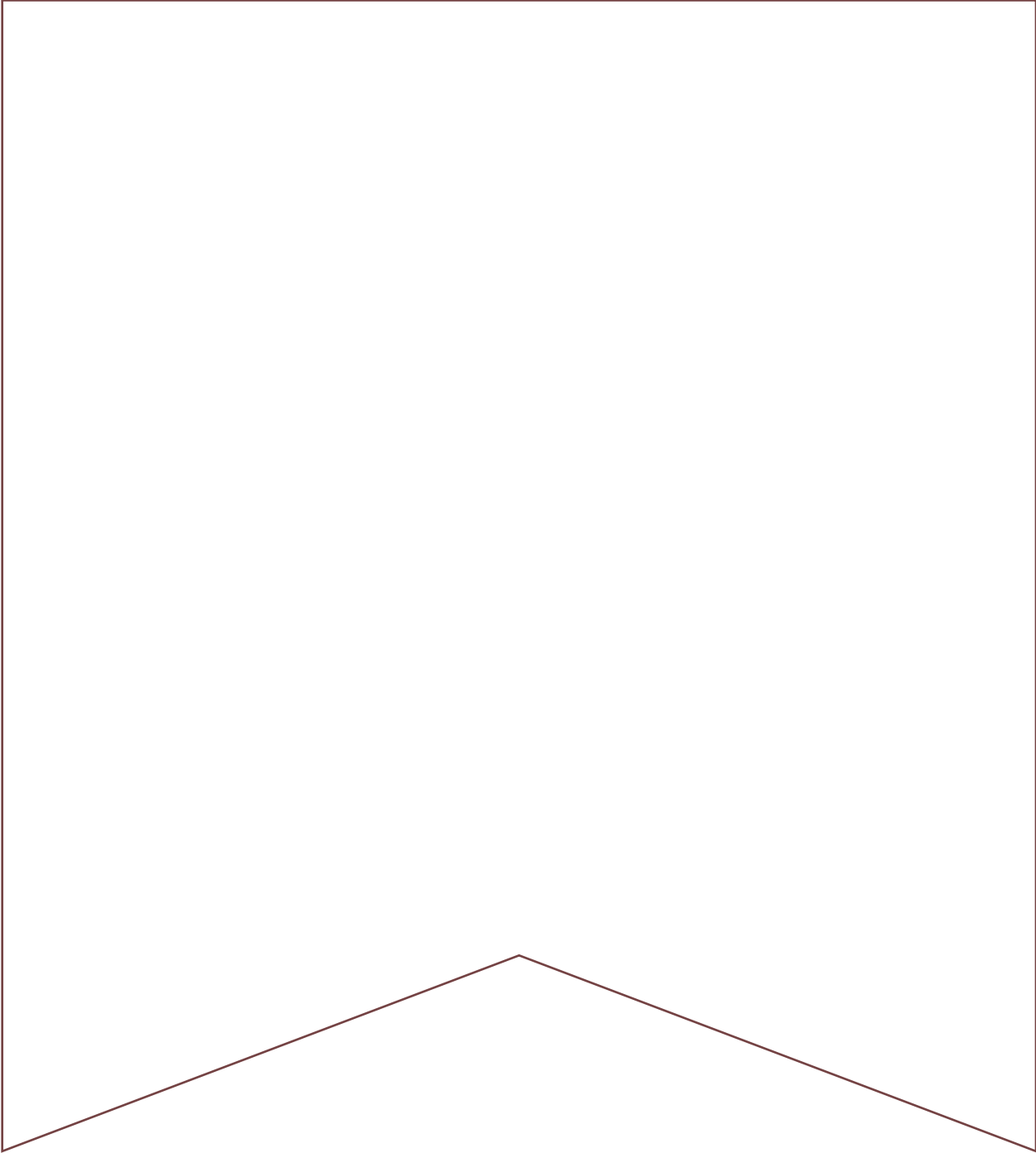


Ideas for Celebrating Completed Books

- 🌀 Make a recipe or craft inspired by the book.
- 🌀 Draw your own cover art for the book.
- 🌀 Create a board game or card game based on the mplot of the book.
- 🌀 Take a field trip based on activity or location mentioned in the book.
- 🌀 Copy one of your favorite quotes into a reading journal.
- 🌀 Make a diorama illustrating your favorite scene.
- 🌀 Create a timeline of the events.
- 🌀 Write an alternate ending.
- 🌀 Write a letter to the author.
- 🌀 Create a paper chain to count the books you've read as a family. Each time a family member completes a book, write the title on a strip of paper and add the link to the chain. See how long your chain gets by the end of the summer!
- 🌀 Make a banner showcasing the books you've completed as a family. Trace the flag template below onto a piece of colorful cardstock or scrapbook paper and cut it out. Then trace the circle template onto a piece of white paper and cut it out as well. Decorate the white circle with the book's title, author or a picture related to the story, and glue it onto the colored flag. Punch holes in the upper corners of the flag and string it on a long piece of ribbon through the holes.
